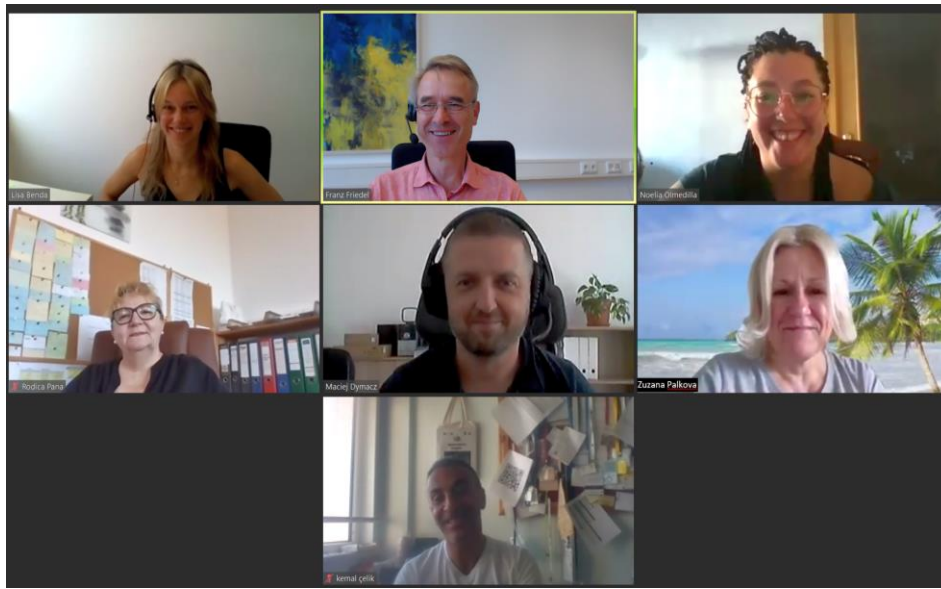

International meeting (online; hosted by Slovakia)



Although it was unfortunately not possible for us to meet in person in Slovakia as planned, we were still able to hold a productive international project meeting in an online format. The training units on occupations and entrepreneurship in rural areas as well as some of the therefore required soft skills had already been completed and translated into all languages of the partner countries involved in spring. Consequently, the focus of our work in recent weeks, as well as in this meeting was on the creation of an attractive website on which the training units will be made available for download.

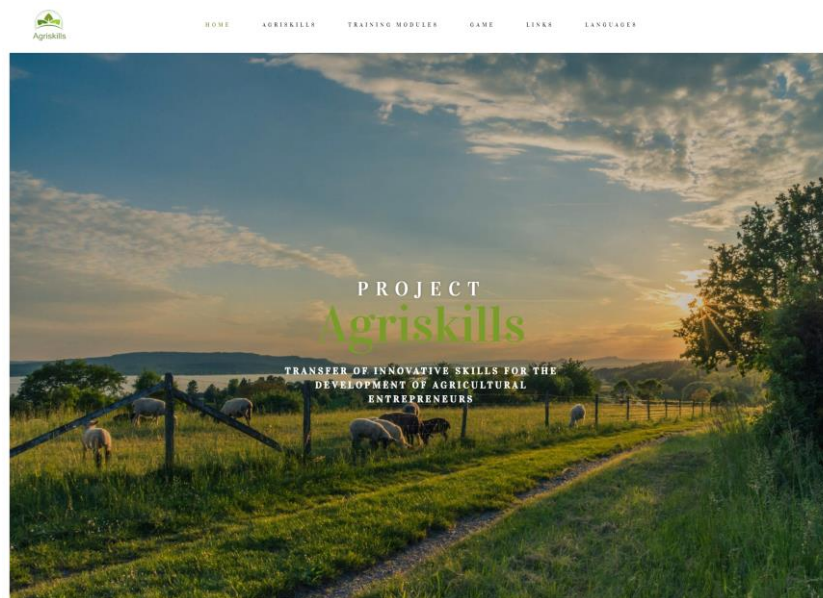
At the beginning of next year, a workshop is to be held by each participating partner during which representatives of corresponding interest groups (agricultural associations and organizations, employees from the education sector, politicians, etc.) will be introduced to the new web offer and feedback will be obtained.

In addition, we have already planned the first steps for the last task package of the project: a game in which young people interested in entrepreneurship are introduced to the options for setting up a business as well as the necessary first steps and requirements.



In a constructive and lively exchange, we discussed and determined the upcoming steps. While the online meeting was successful, all participants would still prefer to meet in person at the next meeting. We are now getting back to work in the hope of being able to discuss the next topics in April in the partner country, Romania.
